Kalispell, MT, August 24, 2021 – Interagency fire managers across northwest Montana are rescinding Stage 2 Fire Restrictions. Recent rain and cooler temperatures have brought needed moisture to forest vegetation and lowered the fire danger across Naorthwest Montana. Fire managers remind the public that debris burning remains is still-closed and does not open until October 1st, 2021.

As the weather continues to cool and we move into the fall, camping and outdoor recreation remain popular activities. Be prepared and have the proper tools to extinguish a campfire before you light it. Bring a bucket, water, and shovel to drown and stir the campfire until it is deadcompletely out. If it's too hot to touch, it's too hot to leave!

The following jurisdictions are rescinding fire restrictions on Wednesday, August 25<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at 12:01AM.

- Flathead National Forest lands including the Great Bear and Bob Marshall Wilderness, in Flathead, Lake, Missoula, Lewis and Clark, and Powell Counties, Montana.
- Kootenai National Forest lands in Flathead, Lincoln, and Sanders Counties in Montana and Kootenai National Forest lands in Bonner and Boundary Counties in Idaho.
- Glacier National Park
- Lost Trail and Swan River National Wildlife Refuge lands.
- Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation, Kalispell, Libby, Plains, Stillwater, and Swan Units. State Land and Private Classified Forested Land within Flathead, Lake, Lincoln and Sanders.
- Montana Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, Region 1 within Flathead, Lake, Sanders, and Lincoln Counties.
- Flathead, Lake, and Lincoln Counties
- F.H. Stoltze Land & Lumber Company lands will open to public use.
- Flathead Ridge Ranch lands will open to public use. Campfires are prohibited.


